FROM THE LEADERSHIP TEAM

COVID-19:

Please note the following still applies:

- Parents are reminded that they <u>must keep their child</u> at home if they are demonstrating flu-like symptoms, ie: sore throat, runny nose, fever, sneezing, coughing, headache, etc.
- Students demonstrating flu-like symptoms at school will be sent home.
- Children who have been absent or sent home due to flu-like symptoms must be tested for COVID-19.
- Students cannot return to school following an absence due to flu-like symptom until they have received a negative COVID test result and the school has been provided with a copy of the negative result before the student can return to school (please screenshot the test result and email to <a href="style="test:style="test: style="test: style=
- If a student has a family member or close contact being tested for COVID-19, they cannot return to school until the negative test result has returned and the school sights the negative test result.



When students are absent from school, parents are reminded to also complete an absent note via Compass and clearly explain the reason for the absence. If an explanation for an absence is not provided or the reason for the absence not clearly stated, teachers may need to follow-up with parents for clarification before students are able to return to the classroom.

Please remember that we still need to be extremely vigilant and families are asked to exercise extreme caution if they are travelling outside the Lithgow area over the weekends.

Social/Emotional Focus:

Last week Mrs Dunleavy spoke with the students around the issues of student privacy and the importance of not getting caught up in 'gossip'. Mrs Dunleavy and classroom teachers will continue to talk about and reinforce this. The focus for this



week and next week will be on not getting caught up in 'drama'. Often children, and adults, can get caught up in the drama of a situation, especially when there is conflict. Drama refers to the excitement of a situation. When we get caught up in drama we can start to engage in 'gossip' and start talking about what we think we know about a situation. When this happens the story almost always gets muddled up because getting caught up in drama can make people exaggerate and add bits to the story. When we get caught up in drama we can get carried away and forget about the feelings of others.

Below is a summary of the social/emotional focus areas. It would be wonderful if parents talked about these focus areas so that our children can see that we are all working together to guide them in their social development. This table is a great one to have on the fridge at home so that parents and children can continue to refer to it. *Continued over.....*
