

I thank Mrs Brown for her preparation and presentation and encourage all parents to come along to future sessions like this in order to stay in tune with what we are doing at St Pat's and to hear the reasons why we are implementing the programs that we are. I also thank the Infants teachers, Mrs Collins and Mrs Marshall who also supported during the session. My message to parents during the session was that we are committed at St Pat's to implementing research-based practices that focus on the explicit teaching of skills that will ensure our students are set up with a solid foundation for life-long learning success. Since we have been implementing the program in Infants and following Sarah's recommendations in the Primary, our end of year DIBELS results are the best we have seen in the history of DIBELS at St Pat's – what an incredible achievement in such a short amount of time!

It was heart-warming to see so many of our wonderful families enjoying a lovely time together, singing Carols and enjoying each other's company. Santa's appearance was certainly a highlight and he and his Elves were so impressed with how well-mannered the children were. Thank you so much Santa for coming to see us! Thank you to our wonderful P&F for providing free tea and coffee and biscuits and for running a great raffle.
