## **AP REPORT**

NAPLAN 2019: Our Years 3 and 5 students will again sit the NAPLAN tests this year. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. At the classroom level it is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress. In 2019 your child will sit the NAPLAN online tests and the tests will take place between the 14th and 24th May 2019. Please keep an eye out for further information being sent out with your children shortly.

ICAS Testing 2019: ICAS Assessments are online\* assessments, designed to recognise and reward academic excellence. The assessments are based on the curricula for the relevant year. Students are asked to demonstrate a deeper, integrated, and thorough level of learning. To ensure an engaging and beneficial experience for all students, new ICAS assessments are developed annually for each subject in every year level. If you wish for your child to participate in any of the following tests, please send the money in a clearly marked envelope to Mrs Marshall and include the subjects for each test they wish to participate in.
